<b>Diagnosis/Definition:</b>		
Elevated PSA Screen: all AA males 40-75 Males with a family history If the patient desires with provider explanation		
<b>Initial Diagnosis and Management:</b>		
PSA of 4 or greater PSA velocity >0.75ng/ml/year, especially if the PSA is less than 4		
<b>Ongoing Management and Objectives:</b>		
Yearly PSA		
<b>Indications for Specialty Care Referral:</b>		
Elevated PSA, abnormal DRE or both		
<b>Test(s) to Prepare for Consult:</b>	<b>Test(s) Consultant May Need To Do:</b>	
PSA	Transrectal ultrasound and prostate needle biopsy
