

If you have any questions, please connect with your immediate supervisor. **Cyber-security improvements** Employees using the AnyConnect login will soon notice a change in access requirements.

Rather than clicking the green approve checkmark on the Duo mobile app, you will be asked to input a passcode, or PIN, to verify permission to access our systems. This change will apply to all Duo-access systems, including DHREMOTEACCESS, and will take effect on April 22, 2024. There is one exemption at this time - this change will not apply to physicians who e-prescribe. Additionally, to best protect Denver Health from cyber-attacks, the cyber-security team has enabled geo blocking. Employees can no longer access Microsoft Office 365 email while


