About 300 to 400 low-income Coloradans with severe mental illnesses need longer hospital stays but don't get them because Medicaid caps inpatient treatment at many psychiatric hospitals to 15 days per month, a requirement that advocates say is harming vulnerable

patients and straining the broader public safety net. For patients who need more care, shorter stays exacerbate their illness. If they're not fully stabilized, they may not understand the full breadth of their condition or the need to take medications, said Dr. Chelsea Wolf, medical
