

Staff allowed to waive new prenatal course fee Effective Jan. 1, 2024, all prenatal education classes will require a \$35 nonrefundable

registration fee for Denver Health patients. These courses include boot camp for new dads, breastfeeding, CPR for mom and partner, newborn care and childbirth. The new, nominal fee is meant to cover the cost to hold these classes for our patients. 


