Safety and security update: New operations center activated

Editor's note: As part of biweekly communication in the 411, we will detail the progression of work in the areas of safety and security at Denver Health.

Denver Health's Security Operations Center in Pavilion J will become the 24/7 home for security dispatchers in 2023, helping to reduce officers' response times to incidents on the main campus.

The SOC, pronounced "sock," is the security team's new communications hub, which allows dispatch to communicate with officers in the field and with law enforcement while monitoring scenes in real time.





Announcing two new senior leaders

Denver Health has filled two long-standing vacant senior leadership roles that will help the health care system advance its mission and strategic objectives with our staff, patients and community.

Dr. Steven Federico is our new chief government and community affairs officer. He is currently the director of general pediatrics and school and community programs, and is an associate professor of general pediatrics at the University of Colorado School of Medicine. His past work at Denver Health has been as director of service for pediatrics in our community health centers and medical director of school-based health centers. In his new role, which he will start in January, Dr. Federico will lead our government relations efforts in better establishing partnerships with and advocating to city, state and federal leaders and groups on behalf of Denver Health.



Jacque Montgomery joins Denver Health as our new chief communications officer. Jacque is currently the director of advancement and external affairs at Colorado Academy. She served as the press secretary for the state of Colorado in the governor's office from 2017-2019, worked as an executive communications consultant at Kaiser Permanente, and prior to that was the executive director of media relations and communications at the University of Colorado Denver, Anschutz Medical Campus. Jacque will start the last week of December and will lead our communications and



marketing team in the areas of internal and external communications, marketing, brand and reputation management, media and crisis communications, and will help advise on outreach communication efforts to our patients and community.
