





The Denver City Council this week approved a "healthy drinks in children's meals" ordinance that requires Denver food establishments to offer healthy drink choices on children's bundled menus. The ordinance, sponsored by council members Chris Hinds and Serena Gonzales-

Gutierrez, will remove the targeted marketing of sugary drinks on children's menus. Now, bundled kids' meals should list the option of either water or unflavored milk/milk substitutes. 


