

As part of organizational efforts to prepare for a cybersecurity incident and prolonged downtime, we must include reliable and resilient communication methods in our planning. Denver Health uses the RAVE Alert mass notification system for emergency notifications.

RAVE Alert is hosted off the Denver Health network, which means we can send communications to employees using this tool during downtime.





Don't forget to "spring forward" one hour! 2024-26 Strategic Plan January Scorecard now available Thank you to the more than 2,000 attendees of our 2024-26 Strategic Plan town halls! The strategy rollout meetings continue with members of Cabinet presenting on the Strategic Plan to individual teams. There are 17 rollout meetings remaining (out of 33 total). Many people have asked how we will measure trust to know if we have achieved our vision of becoming the most trusted health care organization in Colorado by the end of 2026. Living our core values and adhering to our mission are the ingredients that will help us achieve our vision. However, quantitatively, we will measure 14 key indicators of success to gauge how we are doing. These indicators will help us track our organization's progress toward achieving the strategies that will lead to increased trust with our patients, staff, partners and community. Monthly Key Initiatives of Success Scorecards will be posted on the Pulse and shared here to relay these results. The first dataset is available for January and can be accessed below.
