#### Mastercard contactless payments temporarily disabled

The Good Day Café, Main Street Café, OMC Café and gift shop will temporarily be unable to process MasterCard credit card transactions using tap-to-pay/contactless payment beginning **Monday, Nov. 21**. This change will not impact other methods of payment, including tap-to-pay/contactless payment with other credit card companies or physical MasterCard payments using a card swipe or chip transaction. We appreciate your understanding while IT upgrades the system to resolve the issue.

#### Denver Fire using Pavilion H area for training exercises

#### National awareness and recognitions

Antibiotic Awareness Week, Nov. 18-24, and is an annual event to raise awareness about the importance of appropriate antibiotic use. A key message is to avoid antibiotics for viral infections. Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been a dramatic rise in antimicrobial resistance. One of the contributing factors was an increase in antibiotic prescriptions for respiratory infections, which were often unnecessary. Supportive care is the mainstay of treatment for viral infections, and antibiotics should only be prescribed when bacterial infections are confirmed or strongly suspected. Denver Health's **Diabetes Prevention Program** is focusing on prediabetes and preventing type 2 diabetes during **Diabetes Awareness Month** this November. The program is highlighting diabetes risk factors, and educating patients and staff on how to get screened for prediabetes. The condition that leads to diabetes affects one-third of U.S. adults age 18 and up and nearly half of adults age 65 and up, but most don't know they have it.
