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Denver Health ranks high in quality and accountability

The recently released 2022 Vizient Quality and Accountability scorecards showed Denver Health ranked in the top 10% in medication communication and responsiveness of staff; top 20% for doctor communication; top 30% for nurse communication, cleanliness and quietness, and discharge information; and top 40% for overall hospital rating.

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Denver Health sees decline in Target Zero adverse events

In another positive sign about our efforts to improve quality and safety, Denver Health has experienced an encouraging decline in Target Zero adverse events in 2022 compared with the two prior years, almost reaching pre-pandemic levels. Don't delay; get your flu shot today!

All Denver Health employees, contractors, licensed independent practitioners, vendors, temporary workers, volunteers, researchers, residents and students (including those who work from home) are required to receive a flu vaccination by Nov. 1. There are still more than 1,000 individuals who have not yet submitted proof of their influenza vaccination or been granted a religious or medical exemption to the vaccine mandate. Employees may receive their flu vaccination at the Center for Occupational Safety and Health (COSH) clinic on the seventh floor of the OMC in Pavilion L from 7 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Mondays-Fridays (no appointment required).

Documentation of offsite flu vaccinations (including those received at other Denver Health clinics outside of COSH or employee vaccination events) must be sent to Fluinfo@dhha.org. Employees who have not received their flu vaccine or approved exemption by Nov. 1 will be removed from their work schedule for non-compliance and termination will be initiated.


